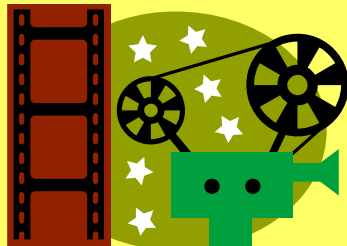
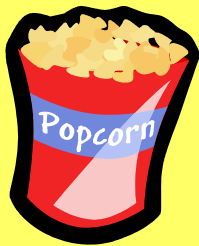

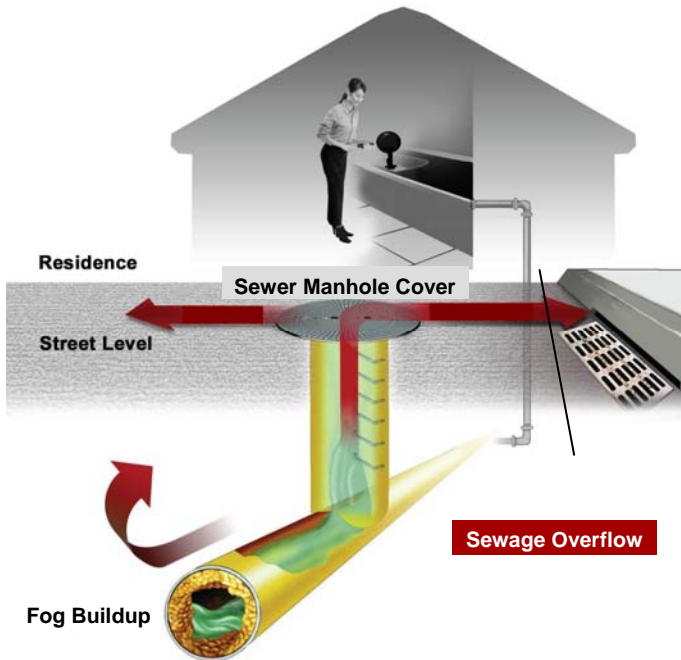
## ATTENTION LAKERIDGE CUSTOMERS : SEWER PROJECT UPDATE

Project participation will save you an estimated \$5,000 to \$10,000 in potential side sewer repair or replacement costs should your side sewer have a problem and need to be replaced by you privately following this opportunity. # SUMMER FOG AFFECTS EVERYONE



It might be a beautiful summer day outside, but FOG is present in many areas of our community. Yes, while you might not be seeing weather-related fog this time of year, there's another type of FOG that is out there with a potential for causing big trouble. Improper disposal of Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) is the leading cause of private drain and public sewer blockages. When FOG enters a drain, it clings to pipe walls and solidifies. Eventually, the pipe becomes clogged and a

backup or overflow occurs. In backup situations, wastewater can flow into the environment. Bacteria and other contaminants eventually end up in lakes, rivers, and Puget Sound, creating health risks for swimmers, fish and plant life. Here's how you can prevent FOG: **NEVER** pour grease or cooking oil down the sink drain or into the toilet. Instead pour grease into an empty soup or vegetable can. Store the can/grease in the freezer until the can is full. Then toss it into the trash.

**SCRAPE** dishes before washing. Don't put grease and food scraps down the drain. Put a basket or strainer in sink drains to catch food scraps and other solids. Empty the contents of the basket or strainer into the

trash. Preventing FOG blockages saves in trouble, time, property damage, personal dollars, customer rates, and the environment. FOG affects everyone. Please dispose of it properly!

## HOUSE FOR SALE OR RENT?

-- PLEASE TAKE NOTE!

One look around our community and many "For Sale" or "For Rent" signs can be seen. Summer months typically bring an increase in the number of people that are moving in or

Under Washington State Law, water and sewer charges attach to the property. Delinquent account balances, if not paid by the seller at home sale or by a tenant upon move out, become the responsibility of the new home owner or of the landlord. Fair or not, it's the law! The District will do its best to
