## Water Supply

Our weather can vary significantly from year to year, and this season we are experiencing higher than normal temperatures and lower than normal rainfall. In addition, this year's low snowpack coupled with the high temperatures and resulting increased demand have increased the potential for lower water supply availability. This combination of weather conditions is putting a significant strain on local and regional water supplies. The water supply issue impacts the entire region and therefore everyone needs to do their part to help.

Skyway Water and Sewer District has three separate sources of water: Cascade Water Alliance (Seattle Public Utilities), City of Renton and District wells. Cascade and its members (the cities of Bellevue, Kirkland, Issaquah, Redmond, Tukwila and the Sammamish Plateau and Skyway Water and Sewer Districts) get some or all of their drinking water from the Seattle water supply.

On July 27th, as a member of Cascade Water Alliance, Skyway joined Seattle Public Utilities (SPU), Tacoma Water and the City of Everett in declaring a Stage 1 Water Advisory. During the water advisory, residents and businesses were asked to continue to use water wisely to help ensure sufficient water supply. On August 11th, the District joined SPU, Tacoma and Everett, in declaring a **Stage 2 Voluntary Curtailment** to "Reduce Your Use". We are

asking residents and businesses to reduce their use of water by 10%. Although the District has more than one source of water, the supply issue impacts our entire region. Taking action now will help



save water for people and fish as we go into the end of summer and early fall. Here are ways you can "reduce your use":

- Take shorter showers
- Wash only full loads of laundry and dishes
- Let your lawn go dormant.
- Water only plants, and only twice each week.
- Water outdoor plants before 8 AM or after 7 PM.
- Check for and fix leaks, including checking for toilets with silent leaks
- Use a broom, not a hose, to clean sidewalks, driveways and patios.

Take your car to a commercial car wash and wash it less often

## **CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS**

ou may have noticed construction work being done at two locations along 84<sup>th</sup> Avenue South in the Bryn Mawr neighborhood.

New water and sewer mains are being installed along South 118th Street for the new Otani Gardens residential development. The public utility work being constructed by the developer's contractor


includes installing new mainline pipes, connecting to the existing water and sewer systems, and reconnecting existing customer services. By the time you read this notice, the water and sewer main work on 82nd Ave. So., 84th Ave So. and South 118th Street should be complete. Paving, sidewalk and landscape work may still be in progress.

Further south near the top of

the hill, work is being done on the Districts capital project: South 126th Place Water Main Replacement. This project includes installing approximately 1,100 lineal feet of 8-inch diameter water main, 10 service connections, and multiple connections to the existing water system. Construction of this project will replace undersized pipes and eliminate dead ends, improving water quality and

system reliability.
