COVID-19 Customer Support Program

In accordance with the Governor's Proclamation 23.6 Ratepayer Assistance and Preservation of Essential Services, the District has developed and adopted its **COVID-19 Customer Support Program**. The Program is intended to keep our customers connected to essential services during the COVID-19 pandemic emergency. The **temporary** billing and collection policies adopted by the Board of Commissioners on March 24, 2020 in response to the COVID-19 Coronavirus pandemic are incorporated in this Program. These <u>temporary</u> policies include:

- Water shut offs for non-payment are temporarily suspended.
- Late fees and lien interest charges are temporarily suspended.
- A property that was previously shut off and is legally occupied will have water service temporarily restored.

Important Notes: The District will continue to charge customer's accounts for water and/or sewer service. The District cannot "forgive" water and sewer service billings under Washington State law.

CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Construction of the District's **Skyway Park Sewer Pump Station Consolidation** capital project awarded to R.L. Alia Company is proceeding very well. Sewer gravity and force main pipe, and water main pipe, have been installed. Two obsolete pump stations are decommissioned. As this newsletter goes to print, much of the asphalt paving has also been completed.

Restoration of grassy and landscaped areas remains to be done. Installation of pumps, piping and controls continues at the main pump station. Major work yet to be done includes system testing, pump station commissioning and site restoration.

There have been impacts to road traffic and parking areas around Skyway Park and foot traffic through the Park. We appreciate everyone's patience and cooperation during the construction. With favorable weather and supplies available, roadway paving for the District's **77th-79th Avenue South**

watermain Replacement project with James A. Guess Inc was done in August. Inspection and preparation of final reports will complete this project. The project included replacement of approximately 1,800 lineal feet of watermain, 5 fire hydrant assemblies, and 34 residential water service connections to improve system reliability and fire protection.



Field survey work has been conducted for the District's **Small Diameter**

Watermain Replacement project and design work has begun. This project is located in the Bryn Mawr neighborhood (So. 115th St to So. 120th St. between 84th Ave So. and Rainier Ave So.) and includes replacement of approximately 6,200 linear feet of existing 2 and 4-inch water main with 8-inch ductile iron pipe.
