King County Sewage Treatment Rates

King County provides wastewater (sewage) treatment service to 34 local agencies, including Skyway, and the County's preliminary 2023 Sewer Rate-Setting process is underway. The County's goals in this process include increased reliability at West Point Treatment Plant and elsewhere; regulatory compliance; growth-related demand response; critical asset management project execution; protect water quality; address climate change impacts; and equitable service delivery.

The adopted 2022 Rate Plan had forecast a 4% annual rate increase through 2025. Preliminary sensitivity forecasts at this time show a 5.5% annual rate increase through 2027 followed by 9.0% rate increases through 2032. CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Construction on the **Small** Diameter Watermain **Replacement** capital project in the Bryn Mawr neighborhood is progressing well. As this issue goes to print, the contractor has installed the last of the new watermain pipe on South 117th Street between 87th Avenue South and Rainier Avenue South. After successful pressure and water quality testing, the remaining water services connections (approximately 6) on South 117th Street will be transferred over (connected) to the new water main. If you only receive sewer service from Skyway Water and Sewer District, you should have received a 2022 Water Quality Report directly from your water service provider - King County Water District No. 125, Seattle Public Utilities or the City of Renton.
