# CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Design of the Rainier Ave So/So 113th Watermain
Replacement project is in progress. The project is located east of Rainier Ave So, north of So 113th Street, and along So. 113th Street east of Rainier Ave So. and replaces ~1,250 linear feet of 6-inch asbestos cement pipe and 2-inch galvanized pipe with new 8-inch ductile iron pipe and replaces existing water service lines, valves and fire hydrants.



The District will be requesting access to your property in the near future to conduct a field survey to gather information critical to the project design. If you receive a letter and have any questions, please contact the District office. Construction is planned for 2023.

he Board of Commissioners of Skyway Water and Sewer District is responsible for setting water and sewer rates. Each year, with the aid of District staff and consultants, they work in open public meetings to analyze the District's operating, maintenance, and capital replacement requirements. Although the COVID-19 Pandemic has subsided, there continue to be lingering impacts to the District and its customers.

In addition to the daily cost of operating the water and sewer systems, the Commissioners must plan for the cost to repair and replace parts of the systems as they become obsolete or deteriorated. This is an ongoing activity and much of our infrastructure, particularly sewer facilities, was originally installed as much as 80 years ago. As part of the rate setting process, District staff develop a 10-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) that prioritizes repair and replacement projects based on the risks and benefits of each individual project. The CIP and rate schedule needed to support ongoing operation and capital work are reviewed by the Board of Commissioners to confirm that the CIP program balances their obligation to maintain your vital water and sewer facilities against the cost to District customers.

The enclosed March bill (for January and February service) reflects a rate increase for both water and sewer. The water increase (\$4.87/month for the average single-family customer) will help to fund the replacement and upsizing of old water mains. The sewer increase (\$1.76/month for the average single-family customer) will help fund the ongoing replacement of your aging sewer collection and transmission system. There is 5.76% increase in the pass-through sewer charges for King County sewage treatment of the District's sewage.

Over the next 6 years, the District's capital improvement program to repair and/or replace aging infrastructure is anticipated to average \$8.2 million dollars per year. The 2023 rate schedule, at a cost of \$3.98 per day for District water and sewer service for the average single-family customer, pays for ALL ongoing system operations and capital projects. The District operates solely on your customer rates; it receives no tax revenue.

#### LOW INCOME DISCOUNT PROGRAM

During 2022, there were 249 qualifying low-income senior or disabled customers that participated in the District's Rate Discount Program. The cost of this program was approximately \$105,843.84 -- \$14,537.52 in water service and \$91.306.32 in sewer service.

#### **HELP FOR THOSE IN NEED**

The District has a Customer Assistance Program (CAP) administered by the Salvation Army for the benefit of District customers who need financial assistance with paying their water and sewer bills.
