


Public Service Announcement – Your Opportunity for Vote

Decades Long Record of Transparency and Responsible Reporting

Every year, the Washington State Auditor's Office (SAO) conducts an audit of the District's financial statements. The purpose of the audit is to assess the District's compliance with applicable laws, regulations, policies and procedures, and the safeguarding of public resources. The financial audit for fiscal year 2021 has been completed and this marks the 30th consecutive year that no findings were reported by the State Auditor!! This accomplishment reflects the historical and ongoing of the District's Board commitment Commissioners and employees to providing strong operational oversight, excellent internal controls, and accurate financial reporting. We thank you for the opportunity to provide you, our customers, with fiscally sound management of your publicly owned water and sewer systems and resources.

CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Design of the Rainier Ave So./So. 113th Watermain Replacement project continues. The District mailed letters to property owners within the project area, requesting access to conduct a field survey. If you received a letter and have not yet responded, you may receive a call from our staff or engineer. Gathering field information is critical to the project design.



Notices were also mailed to tenants occupying properties within the project area, informing them of the upcoming project and our coordination with the property owner. If you receive a letter and have any questions, please call the District office. The project is located east of Rainier Ave So., north of So. 113th Street, and along So. 113th Street east of Rainier Ave So. and replaces ~1,250 linear feet

of 6-inch asbestos cement pipe and 2-inch galvanized pipe with new 8-inch ductile iron pipe and replaces existing water service lines, valves and fire hydrants. Construction is planned for 2023.

As reported in the July issue, the District was awarded a \$1,000,000 Equitable Wastewater Futures grant by King County to extend District sewer mains in order to make public sewer service available to residents currently on septic systems. Field survey was recently conducted as the first step in design of the 80th Avenue South Sewer Extension project to construct approximately 700 linear feet of new sewer main north along 80th Avenue South, across Renton Avenue South, continuing north to the intersection at South 126th Street. This project will accomplish crossing a major barrier, Renton Avenue South, which is a primary transportation corridor. Work is planned to be completed by December 2024.

Many products we use every day, such as cleaning supplies, varnish, motor oil, oil-based paints, and pesticides, contain ingredients that are toxic, corrosive, flammable, or reactive. household hazardous waste to any of our four collection sites or to the Traveling

Wastemobile. You don't need to make an appointment, and there's no fee for this service.

Residents and small businesses can safely **drop off household** hazardous waste such as oilbased paint, batteries, antifreeze, or pesticides to the Wastemobile at no cost.
